The winners of the Future of Learning competition have been announced today, 21st September, with young people from across Scotland recognised for their visions of the future.

Part of SIE's summer festival of innovation, the Future of Learning competition invited young people to consider the learning environment of the future. With support from workshops during the festival, they had to create a short video showing a day in the life of a learner in 5 years time and submit it to judges.
